DO SOME RESEARCH

- Volunteer at a local hospital or assisted living facility.

WHERE CAN I WORK?

HOSPITALS

Nearly every job in healthcare is represented at hospitals. Being in a hospital environment is a great way to get acquainted with new specialties and work environments you may be curious about.

PHYSICIAN OFFICES

Physician Offices usually offer a "normal" schedule of 9-5 and 5-days a week without requiring nights or weekends. Patients are well enough to bring themselves to a physician office and may simply require vaccinations or adjustment of medications.

HOME HEALTHCARE SERVICES

Home Healthcare providers work independently in a setting within the community with a focus on coordination of care. Keeping patients safe at home, avoiding hospitalizations, and helping them regain their health and self-sufficiency are at the heart of home healthcare service.

NURSING CARE FACILITIES

Nursing care facilities rely on teams of different professionals to collectively take care of residents. Many patients in skilled nursing facilities have deteriorating diseases and require comfort until end of life.

OUTPATIENT CLINICS

Outpatient clinics and urgent care centers are other places that people go to receive care. Ambulatory clinics/centers are medical facilities that perform procedures and treatments but do not require an overnight stay. Urgent care centers provide treatment for minor emergencies, illness, and injuries including laboratory and X-ray testing.
